Background: Expanded Regional Scope Since 2012


- Since 2012, the Initiative has been expanding its activities and capacity building processes to Caribbean and Pacific ACP countries

 (Guyana, Cook Islands, Vanuatu, FSM,...)

Supporting Ratification and National Implementation: *The Foundation*



Country level support: Briefing of stakeholders about ABS/NP and identifying approaches for ratification/implementation

- Vanuatu (March 2012): Individual stakeholder briefings; need for broader stakeholder consultation and stock-taking of relevant legislation
- Samoa (May 2012): Briefing of relevant government institutions
- Palau (May2012): Stakeholder briefings
 (government, Traditional Council of Chiefs, Palau
 Conservation Society); recommendations for
 roadmap towards ratification and implementation

Supporting Ratification and National Implementation: The Foundation

Country level support: Briefing of stakeholders about ABS/NP, identifying approaches for ratification/implementation and national ABS workshops

- Vanuatu (November 2012): Further stakeholder consultations; briefing and planning workshop with VANGO and government representatives; concept for GEF/SGP Strategic Grant to identify PIC process with local communities
- **FSM** (August and November 2013): national ABS workshops for stocktaking and gap assessment and identifying elements of a national ABS policy
- Cook Islands (November 2013): Stakeholder consultations; briefing workshops for relevant government institutions and the House of Ariki; contributions to the development of a GEF-NPIF project for adapting the ABS draft bill to the NP

The International Treaty and the Nagoya Protocol – A Tandem Workshop for National Focal Points 3-6 June 2014, Rome, Italy



Outcomes

Positive impact on the national processes by bringing together the respective national focal points and thus triggering direct discussions and concrete cooperation.

- Better understand the two different ABS systems under the ITPGRFA and the Nagoya Protocol
- Identify the core issues at the interface of the ITPGRFA and the Nagoya Protocol
- Elaborate approaches for mutually supportive administrative processes and cooperation
- > 50 participants, including representatives from SPREP and SPC

IDLO Capacity Building Course for Lawyers from the African, Caribbean and Pacific Region - Building Legal Frameworks to Implement the Nagoya Protocol, 28 July-1 August 2014, Rome, Italy



Outcomes

Build capacities of national actors and accompany national processes to develop legislation and legal tools for the achievement of Aichi Biodiversity Target 16

- Understand the concept of ABS as established by the CBD, NP and related agreements
- Provide an overview of the obligations under the NP and associated national processes
- Understand the approaches taken by other countries (Brazil, India, South Africa) to implement key components of the NP
- Recall practical techniques and skills to design and facilitate interventions to accompany national legal processes to implement the NP.

Mutually Agreed Terms - Contracts to Make ABS Functional 5-8 August 2014, Nadi, Fiji

Outcomes

- Key elements of ABS agreements
- Relevant aspects of contract law
- Negotiation skills required to conclude successful ABS agreements

40 Participants (National ABS Focal Points and representatives from the Competent National Authorities of countries in the Pacific region)



Workshop to Develop the ABS Policy of Pohnpei State (FSM), 2-4 September 2014

< 45 participants (government representatives, traditional leaders and NGO representatives) to develop Pohnpei's draft ABS policy

Outcomes

- Discussion and clarification of land rights and ownership of genetic resources
- Discussion of appropriate decision-making structures in government
- Roles of stake- and rightsholders in obtaining PIC, negotiating MAT and benefit-sharing
- **Draft ABS Policy for Pohnpei** for further discussion with other relevant government functionaries and traditional leaders. Based on these discussions finalization and implementation of the policy.

ABS Capacity Development Needs in SIDS - Dimensions and Potentials of Marine Bioprospecting: Side event at 3rd UNSIDS Conference, Apia, Samoa, 1-4 September 2014



Focus

SIDS are challenged implementing the NP at national level

- Considerable interest of cosmetic and (phyto-)pharmaceutical industries
- Very unique traditional knowledge and specific traditional governance schemes
- Research activities in marine environments for new compounds are increasing.
- Most activities occur in coastal waters and huge exclusive economic zones (EEZs)




