






The Core Principle of ABS: Art. 15 CBD





"technology-rich" countries share benefits arising from genetic resources; facilitate the access to technologies and means important for conservation and sustainable use

2010:

Nagoya Protocol on ABS





- Entered into force in October 2014
- Currently 75 Parties

Legal certainty and transparency


- For providers: ensuring benefit-sharing once GR leave the provider country for utilization
- Preventing misappropriation of GR and associated traditional knowledge (aTK)
- For users: providing for clear and transparent procedures for access to GR and aTK

 Genetic resources within the scope of Article 15 CBD and the benefits arising from the utilization of such resources



 Traditional knowledge associated with genetic resources within the scope of the CBD and the benefits arising from the utilization of such knowledge




 <u>Utilization</u> = research & development on the composition of genetic resources, including biotechnology
