BUT

Some Benefit Sharing is possible even without ABS Measures, if agreed in a contract.

HOW TO GET USERS TO ENTER INTO BENEFIT SHARING CONTRACTS ???

The legal origins of ABS

UN Charter and principles of international law (CBD Art 3): ... <u>States have the sovereign right to exploit their own</u> resources pursuant to their own environmental policies...

CBD Art 15: ... *authority to determine access rests with national governments and is subject to national legislation...*

Nagoya Art 6.1: ... <u>subject to domestic ABS legislation or</u> <u>regulatory requirements, access to GR for their utilization</u> <u>shall be subject to the PIC of the Party providing such</u> <u>resources...</u>

Nagoya Articles 6.2 and 7 (GR owned by IPLCs, and aTK): ... take measures as appropriate in accordance with domestic law ...

AU Guidelines and ABS Clearing House

A: Africa's highest decision-making organ – the AU Assembly of Heads of State and Government – has decided that PIC is required for access to African GR and aTK – even in countries with no ABS laws or regulations in place >>

B: The surest way to prevent an assumption of free access in a country is to put a notification of PIC requirements on the ABS CH >>

C: Nagoya Art 24 encourages even non-Parties to contribute appropriate information to the ABS CH >>

THEREFORE the <u>first and most basic ABS Measure</u> is to put a notice on the ABS CH that your country requires PIC and MAT
