Protect, restore and sustainably manage use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss

✓ Target 15.6: Promote **fair and equitable sharing of the benefits** arising from the utilization of genetic resources and promote appropriate access to such resources.

- ✓ Value chains, especially with Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities.
- ✓ Rural development, food security, improved nutrition and sustainable agriculture.
- ✓ Mutually Agreed Terms = joint ventures.














Promote sustained, inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all

- ✓ Partnerships / pacts for innovation.
- ✓ Innovation with a purpose and within "leaving no one behind" framework (ABS, CBD 8a, etc.).



Build resilient infrastructure, promote inclusive and sustainable industrialization and foster innovation

















 - ➤ Who is included in this "collectiviness"?



The Nagoya Protocol provides further clarity, transparency and legal certainty for genetic resources, and associated traditional knowledge.











Final considerations on ABS & NP:

- ✓ ABS as a tool for development.
- ✓ The 2030 Agenda is about implementation, not about planning.
- ✓ This is supported by the NP, where ABS is not considered as an aspiration.
- ✓ The Nagoya Protocol approach as a innovation and power tool to achieve the 2030 Agenda and its SDGs.
