

February 2013 Seventh Pan-African ABS Workshop

25 February - 1 March 2013, Phalaborwa, South Africa

Department of Environmental Affairs, South Africa

Since 2006, the ABS Initiative has convened six Pan-African workshops, as well as numerous training courses and workshops with a regional or issue-based focus. Following the discussions of the 6th Pan African Workshop in Limbé, Cameroun in January 2012, the Department of Human Resources, Science and Technology of the African Union Commission requested the ABS Initiative to support the development of the AU guidelines for the implementation of the Nagoya Protocol in Africa, based on a gap analysis report on the African Union model Law.

A draft of these guidelines will be presented at the workshop and will provide the framework for the thematic organization of the event. Main **objectives** of this workshop will therefore be to:

- Collect reflections and comments on the draft AU Guidelines regarding its use and usefulness, while also considering the "Traditional Knowledge and Plant Genetic Resources Guidelines" developed by SANBio/NEPAD.
- Provide a practical example of national implementation by showcasing a local bioprospecting case, providing more input for further discussion.
- Reflect the outcomes of the workshop on traditional knowledge in Bengaluru, India, and further discuss questions regarding documentation, valorization and compliance of traditional knowledge.

In line with these objectives we expect to achieve the following **outputs:**

- Reflections, comments and technical approval of AU Guidelines, while taking the SANBio/NEPAD guidelines into
 considerations.
- Coordination of the African Group on Article 10, and kick-start the process of the nomination of experts by each country.
- Identification of challenges and recommendations for the future work under the ABS Initiative on the linkages between ABS, TK and IPR for effective national implementation of the Nagoya Protocol.

In addition, the workshop will provide an opportunity to discuss the preparatory requirements for a not yet scheduled meeting of an expert group on Art. 10, and ICNP-3 tentatively scheduled for 3 to 7 February 2014. Furthermore, there will be an opportunity to discuss the draft EU regulation for implementing the Nagoya Protocol.

Participants

Up to 140 participants including ABS National Focal Points, representatives of competent national authorities for ABS, representatives of relevant regional and international (research) institutions, NGO's, indigenous and local communities, as well as representatives of the private sector involved in bio-trade and bio-prospecting.

Simultaneous interpretation English/French/English will be available for the plenary sessions of the workshop.
